★ NOTES


**I have resized and edited our original Free Coaster designs for stitching on Tulle or satin for these decorations. The satin stitch edge is thinner than the edge I would use on fabric and batting Coasters. – *these edited designs are for stitching on tulle, netting or satin only.*

**It is very important when stitching these designs, that you use the correct Water-Soluble Stabiliser

- You MUST use a fabric type Water Soluble Stabiliser
- DO NOT use the plastic looking Solvy which is used for holding down nap on napped fabrics (towels)



★ FLOWERS



Make the Flowers as per Darina's Cake Decoration Blog

- Hoop up just one layer of wash away and lay one or two layers of the fabric you choose. Eg mesh, tulle, net, chiffon etc.
- Stitch the outline (Color 1) on the stabiliser.
- Add the fabrics (one or two layers) and stitch Color 2 to attach. These fabrics could be a tulle and a softer fabric for effect.
- Trim away the excess then continue with the embroidery.
- There is no need to put a layer on the back of the hoop as the stabiliser washes away easily under a hot running tap. I don't necessarily remove it all as it helps to shape the flowers and give them a bit of body.
- Once rinsed away I put on a tea towel and dab the worst of the water away, then if required position over the lids of the essence bottles (or chosen item) and press around the lid with your fingers.



★ FREE BUTTERFLY



The Free-standing lace Butterfly is stitched it on 2 layers of Water-Soluble Stabiliser (Fabric type)

Using the pictured [Cotton thread from Echidna](#)

CONSTRUCTION

- Using matching Bobbin Thread
- Hoop 2 layers of Water-Soluble Stabiliser
- Stitch Design
- Once completed, remove design from hoop
- Cut away excess stabiliser close to the edge
- Place in a dish of warm water to remove excess stabiliser
